### How Two Friends Helped an Afghan Family Start Fresh in Lafayette

When the Taliban took Afghanistan in August 2021, many Afghans were forced to flee their homes. Among them was a family of five who arrived in Lafayette with nothing but the clothes on their backs. Luckily, the struggling family had a support circle ready to receive and help them.

Mary Brooks, a wealth advisor with real estate connections, and Robineve Cole of Robineve & Co. Interiors, were two of the many local people who joined forces to help the family. Working with a Biden Administration pilot program for newly arriving refugees called the Sponsor Circle Program for Afghans, the two joined other community members to quickly mobilize and provide the family with food, clothing, shelter, and so much more. The expanding circle of sponsors also helped find the family a place to live and enroll their children in school.

"We left everything we knew," said Abrahim Amirzad, the father of the family. "We were so grateful for the help we received from our sponsor circle. Everyone made us feel so welcome in Lafayette." Before being forced to flee, Abrahim was a nurse who assisted the military forces. The well-educated

family enjoyed an upper-middle-class lifestyle before their world was thrown into chaos.

The Amirzad's story in connection with Mary's sponsor circle made national news when it was picked up by the New York Times and CNN. "We were just so moved by their plight," said Mary. "We wanted to do whatever we could to help them."

Mary called on her connections to find housing and other supportive services. Robineve used her interior design expertise and considerable network of clients and colleagues to collect beautiful furniture, rugs, and artwork that made the family feel right at home.

The Sponsor Circle pilot program has since been expanded into an umbrella program called Welcome Corps, which now includes other immigrant groups. Robineve says, "I'm so glad that this program exists. It's a great way for communities to come together and help those in need." This story of Mary, Robineve, and the family they helped is a reminder of the importance of compassion and community. "When we come together, we can make a real difference in the lives of others."

It is helpful to recall that most of us were born of ancestors that were immigrants to America at one time or another. If you would like to help those new to America, you can go to welcomecorps.org to start your own Sponsor Circle or learn how to help families transition to a new life.

Lafayette is known for its natural beauty, a strong sense of community, and its commitment to sustainability. Lafayette unveiled a new rain garden this spring at the southwest corner of First Street and Golden Gate Way. The rain garden is adjacent to Lafayette Creek and very close to where a historic swimming hole used to be. The swimming hole was a popular spot for locals and a great place to cool off on a hot day. Lafayette Creek eventually meets Las Trampas Creek near the Gazebo.

The rain garden brings visitors closer to this iconic creek and is designed to capture and filter stormwater runoff from the surrounding area. Rain gardens help prevent stormwater runoff from polluting local waterways and tame heavy rains from causing flooding. They also help improve water quality by removing pollutants as it percolates through the soil.

The rain garden construction was a collaborative effort between the city of Lafayette, the Lafayette Creeks Committee, and local volunteers. A grant from the California Department of Water Resources funded the project. The space contains pathways, fencing, benches, and native plantings.

The rain garden is a great example of how sustainable practices can be integrated into our community. It is a beautiful and peaceful space and provides a place for people to relax and enjoy the outdoors while being reminded of days gone by.



elen Gough was designated "Volunteer of The Year" by Lamorinda Village in 2019, the first year the award was given. Her comment about the award reveals much about her. She said, "I was shocked and astonished as board members had done so much for the village. But board members were ineligible since it is designated a 'community service' award. It included all the things I was doing as a volunteer for the Bedford Gallery, library, cat rescue and Caring Hands."

When asked why she volunteers so readily, Helen gave a lesson that we can all learn from. She restated her mother's advice: "For many people, getting old creates a feeling of uselessness because when one arises in the morning, all one can look forward to is a long, empty day. Volunteering can prevent this empty feeling and your day can become as full as when you were



working. Moreover, you can feel good after having had a meaningful day." Helen's volunteer activities are the icing on the cake of an outstanding and rewarding career.

Helen grew up in Berkeley and, following high school, attended Wellesley College near Boston. She majored in chemistry and minored in art history. When I asked why, she replied, "I needed a degree that would earn me a good living, and I also loved art, so I went for the best of both worlds." Since college chemistry requires a good science and math background, Helen showed that she was academically prepared. After college, while vacationing at Lake Tahoe, she met Nobel Laureate Dr. Wendell M. Stanley. He offered her a job in his lab at UC Berkeley where she worked in the field of virology. That same virology lab is now the Stanley Laboratory in his honor.

Her volunteer activities range widely and include working with feral cats and working in the Lafayette Library's bookstore. During the COVID Pandemic, she was instrumental in informing residents of the free food delivery offered to housebound people by Lamorinda Village. Helen said that these phone calls were among the most rewarding of her volunteer career.

In her spare time, Helen enjoys her book club, obeys her cats and struggles to read all of her New Yorker magazines.

### DEAR ABBEY,

### DO YOU HAVE ANY ADVICE FOR SENIORS ABOUT FALL DETECTION DEVICES?

I covered the topic of preventing fall risks in the April issue of *Greet Lafayette*, but it's important to explore how seniors can benefit from technology that alerts family and emergency respondents in the event of an actual fall. Wearing a fall detection device is so important as we age, especially if you are living alone. I don't have to tell you that falls can lead to serious injuries, such as broken bones, head injuries and even death.

Various fall detection devices are available on the market:

- Wearable devices can be worn on the wrist, around the neck, or even the waist. They typically use accelerometers to detect falls.
- In-home systems use sensors in the home to detect falls. They can also include features such as two-way voice communication and medication reminders.

If you are a senior, talk to your doctor about which fall detection approach is best for you. Some devices have more features than others. Consider which features would be important to you, such as two-way voice communication, medication reminders, and fall history tracking. Also, look for a device that is easy to put on and take off, and is waterproof (since many falls happen in the bathroom).



### How to Prevent and Treat Age Spots

Age spots are small, flat, brown or black patches that can appear on the skin as we age. They are also known as solar lentigines, liver spots or sunspots. Age spots are caused by a buildup of melanin, the pigment that gives skin its color. They are more common in people with fair skin who have spent a lot of time in the sun. While age spots are not harmful, they can be unsightly. There are several things you can do to prevent and treat them.



#### **PREVENTING AGE SPOTS**

Protecting your skin from the sun is one of the best ways to prevent age spots. Try to wear sunscreen every day, even on cloudy days. Also, choose a sunscreen with an SPF of 30 or higher and reapply it every two hours or more often if you are sweating or swimming. Additionally, take oral supplements that have polypodium leucotomos and vitamin B3 to augment sun protection efforts beyond just applying sunscreen. Polypodium leucotomos, a fern extract, contains antioxidants that may help protect skin from inflammation, sun damage, and rashes caused by sun exposure. Wearing protective clothing when you are in the sun also is very helpful, such as a hat, sunglasses, and long-sleeved shirts. Do avoid tanning beds. Tanning beds emit ultraviolet (UV) radiation which can damage your skin and lead to age spots.

#### TREATING AGE SPOTS

If you already have age spots, there are some things that can help to lighten or remove them. Over-the-counter

treatments, such as hydroquinone creams, retinoids, and alpha hydroxy acids, can be effective in lightening age spots. Prescription treatments, such as laser therapy and chemical peels, can also be effective in removing age spots.

In addition to the tips above, there are a few common sense things one can do to help prevent or reduce the development of age spots.


- Eat a healthy diet that is rich in fruits, vegetables, and
- whole grains
- Get regular exercise
- Manage stress
- Quit smoking

By following these tips, you can help to keep your skin looking young and healthy.




