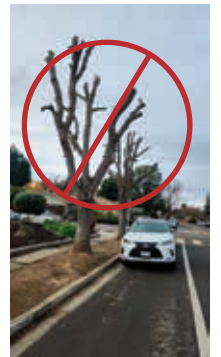

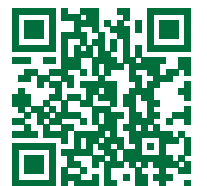

Wassail Concert: The winter Wassail Concert is always such a fun and festive choir event every year. We pay homage to the festivities of the holidays and sing songs like “The Most Wonderful Time of the Year,” “Silver Bells,” and even incorporate audience sing-alongs that are always a super fun.

The honors choirs Chamber and Bel Canto are more selective and on the smaller side, but they’re incredibly cohesive. You can really tell how much technique and intention they put into their pieces. As a senior who has been in choir for four years, this was my last winter concert. I was sad to be leaving it behind, but even more emotional knowing it was my last “Silent Night.” All the choirs sing Silent Night together at the end of the concert to close the night. We’ve kept this tradition every year, and what draws us back to it is how powerful it feels both to sing and to experience the room. We begin by singing in unison, and then we transition into performing the song in sign language. It always surprises the audience, and I think that moment pulls them deeper into the music. After that round, we move into the aleatory section when every singer begins at different times. Our choir director, Mark Roberts, wanted us to step away from the safety of blending as one and instead rely on our own independence and individual strengths.

This part of the concert is the most powerful. You hear voices moving in different directions sometimes blending into beautiful harmonies, and sometimes creating striking contrasts. With everyone singing at different times and tempos, it creates a kind of organized chaos that’s uncommon in typical choir performances. It conveys a feeling of eagerness, tension, and even confusion for those who have never heard anything like it. Last night, I saw people shed tears and that’s when I knew we had done our job as a choir. All in all, this Wassail Concert was incredibly successful. We sang in Hebrew and performed an African hymn called “Hlonolofatsa,” which was accompanied by African drums and filled with energy and dancing. Our Hebrew piece, “Dirshou Adonai,” focused on overlapping melodies and finding harmony while singing different parts. One thing about Campo choirs is that we never stick to just English, we explore many languages, and that makes our performances even more special. After months of

rehearsing the same songs over and over, being able to share them with people feels amazing.

My choir teacher mentioned that this year’s class is the largest in Campolindo history. I’m in a choir with 100 students, and when we all sing together, it’s truly beautiful. It’s incredible to be part of something so special at Campolindo and to share it in concerts like this.

IT ALL BEGAN IN 1920, when the building that is today known as Sisi's Cafe & C.C. & Co Hair Designs was built, awaiting its perfect occupants and purpose. Cathy Corsi and family moved from Italy to CA in 1954, when she was a young girl. She was active as a dancer by 14, started weekend cosmetology school at 15, met her late husband Aldo at 16, and was married at 19. She started her own salon business and hired a team.

They bought the current building in 1998 and a good friend helped divide the space, which eventually became salon/coffee shop. Her two daughters began working as baristas when they were young adults, and continue to work at the family business today in varying capacities. They have both since had their own children (3 total grandkids) and the cycle continues with the 3rd

generation working at the coffee house, managing the family business.

One way that Cathy intentionally keeps the family together is by hosting dinner at her house every Monday and Tuesday evening. They gather for a traditional and delicious Italian supper, and remain a very tight knit family.

Cathy's talents and contributions don't end at owning a business, doing hair and being a wonderful matriarch.

She also started painting 25 years ago with her best friend Joann. They get inspired on Tahoe trips, which is where the family recreates away from the shop. Cathy's many paintings can be seen (some for sale) on the walls of Sisi's.



SAINT MARY’S COLLEGE ANNOUNCED late last year that they would be adding Division I swimming & water polo programs for the 2026 school year. We got to know **Ellie Monobe**, who had been the head coach at Pepperdine, and is now the head coach for both the men’s and women’s inaugural 2026-27 season.

While with the Pepperdine Waves, Monobe led them to their first-ever conference championship in 2022 as members of the PCSC. Then another title win in 2023 before moving to the MPSF. In 2025, they earned their 3rd conference title in four years and their first in the MPSF.

Monobe has also earned four Coach of the Year awards. In 2021, 2022, and 2023 she earned the designation with the PCSC and last season she won the award in the MPSF.

She competed for the Golden Bears for four seasons from 2007-2011 as a breaststroke and IMer.

of which she devotes to her French Bulldog.

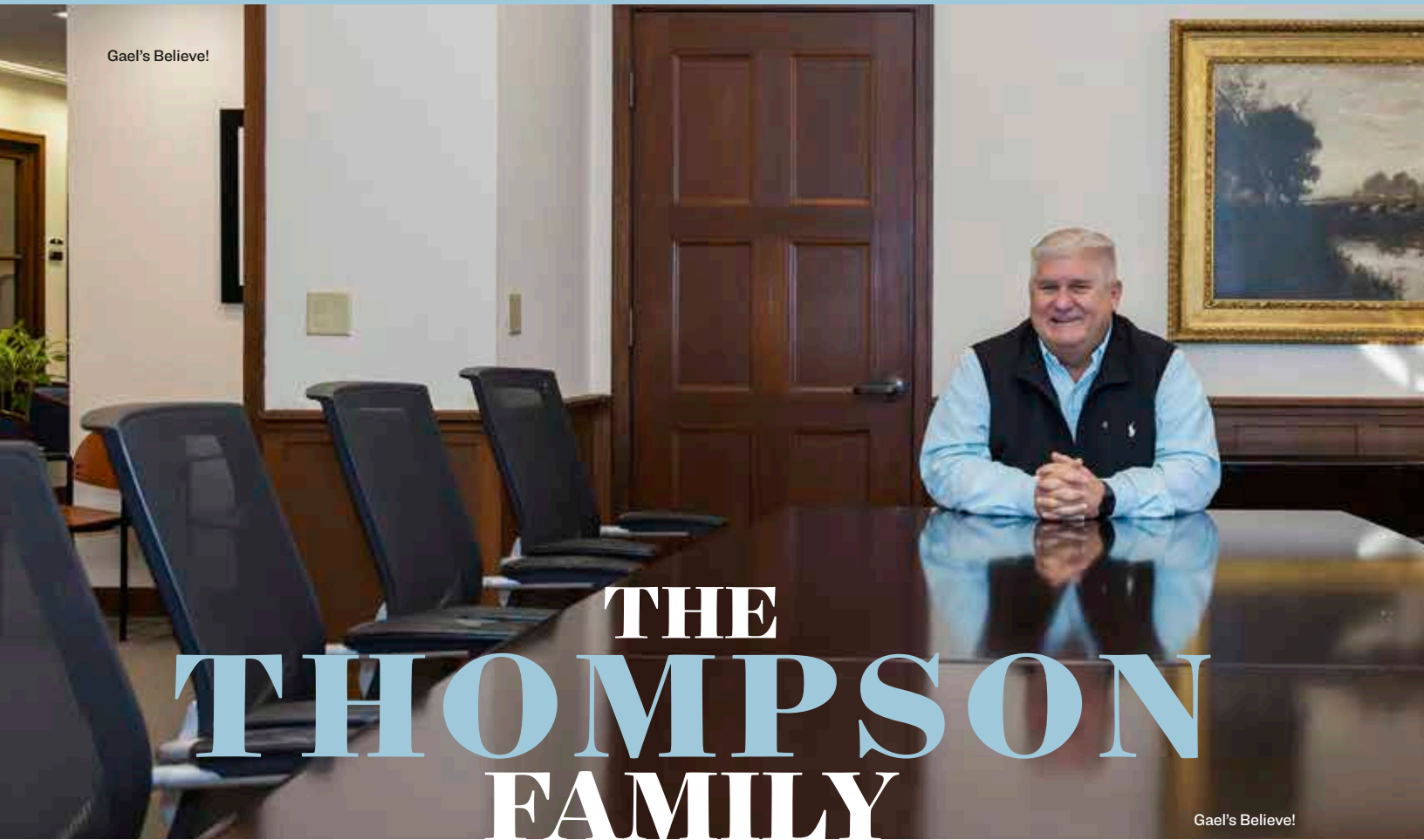
Ellie will be focused on further defining her coaching goals and building her roster in the coming months, and we will be focused on watching her success!

Moraga Art Gallery (MAG) - Artist Review

Each month we will be honored to showcase an artist from MAG and post about local events involving the arts.

Elizabeth Kennen, Moraga Art Gallery's newest member, is a Bay Area native who currently lives in Pleasant Hill. Her love of local nature and wildlife kindles her work. Encouraged by her parents and art teachers, she pursued her passion for drawing plants and animals and began painting as a young adult. Granville Redmond, whose work she admired at the Crocker Art Museum, is just one of early California artists who inspires her. Spending time at the coast, especially Monterey Bay fuels her creativity. Walking a beautiful trail, appreciating the landscape, and bird watching motivate her. Sometimes her subjects include architecture, perhaps a historical building in a lovely setting. She wants her love of a subject to be communicated to the viewer, so that they might feel invited to the scene.

Kennen's favorite medium is watercolor. She also enjoys colored pencils and often combines the two media. Her essential materials are paints, graphite and colored pencils, small brushes, an eraser, paper towels and 140lb cold press paper. Her process begins when her 'WOW' reaction to a place or subject in nature happens. Something amazing and beautiful captures her attention and she takes photographs to use as resources once back in her studio. She studies her photos, decides on a composition and begins sketching. Her process continues by slowly layering colors, concentrating on one section at time and emphasizing detail. Figuring out when a painting is finished takes time, so she lives with it for a while before adding the final details. Like many artists, she has learned to overcome creative blocks by pausing a project and moving on to something else. In order to work she needs time to focus and beautiful music playing.

When asked about her connection to the local community she answered, "I believe art is important to help make local communities vibrant and interesting. Seeing the work of local artists in galleries and various venues inspires me. Visual art brings beauty to our environment and sparks interesting conversations. It can lift our spirits. Art makes us more human. Visual art, music, dance, theatre are all important to our community."

To address the challenge of finding a venue to exhibit, she advises emerging artists to join an organization like Lamorinda Arts Alliance. Marketing and networking in the community is

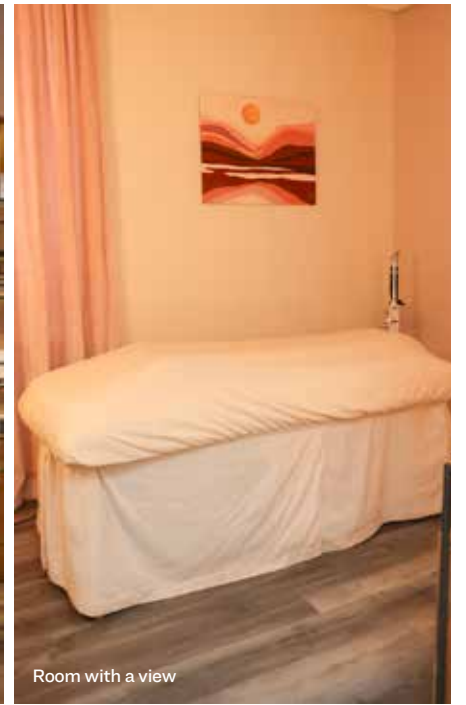

YARD DESIGN & IMPLEMENTATION BY SECRET GARDEN LANDSCAPES

CREATING A 'BACKYARD SANCTUARY': A GARDEN REMODEL GROWN WITH VISION

After 14 years in the neighborhood, this home has grown alongside the Moragans who live in it — and now, its garden finally reflects that sense of ease, connection, and enjoyment that makes the area so special.

For more than a decade, the backyard remained largely unchanged. While it had some charm, much of the space wasn't truly livable. The terrain sloped unevenly, areas weren't graded for use, and older elements like fencing, concrete, and rocks limited how the family could enjoy the outdoors. With the weather here being so inviting year-round, the owners knew they wanted to make better use of the backyard — especially as a place to gather and relax — but they didn't have a clear vision or the time to figure out what to do. Gardening wasn't really their strength, and the space needed a thoughtful, integrated approach.

FINDING THE VISION

The inspiration ultimately came from places that already felt like a retreat: wineries in Napa and Sonoma. The goal became creating a Mediterranean-inspired sanctuary — a garden that felt grounded, calming, and welcoming.

That vision truly came together once they partnered with Laura Osteen, of Secret Garden Landscapes, whose design approach stood out immediately. Rather than a one-size-fits-all concept, she helped the homeowners *discover* what they wanted. Her thoughtful design drew on vintner landscapes, incorporated pavers that felt natural underfoot, and — importantly — opened

up the fence line to expand views and create a more connected feel with the surrounding environment.

DESIGNING WITH INTENTION

One of the biggest challenges was working with the property's natural slopes. The garden includes both downhill and uphill elements, which required careful planning to ensure usability, sustainability, and long-term stability. Soil quality became a major focus, not only to support plant life but also to reinforce the structural integrity of the space.

Laura's engineering minded focus made a noticeable difference here. She brought a balance of creativity and practicality that set her apart, and her clear communication style helped the homeowners feel confident throughout the process.

PERSONAL TOUCHES THAT MADE IT HOME

While the homeowners don't consider themselves DIYers, they did add a few meaningful elements. A raised garden bed now produces herbs and lettuces, adding both beauty and function. Near the gate — once an overlooked strip of space — they created a rose garden that has become a small cutting garden, complete with jasmine and rosemary. These details bring fragrance, color, and a sense of life to the edges of the garden.

A SPACE MEANT TO BE SHARED:

One of the most rewarding moments came when the family hosted a graduation party for 80 people — and the garden handled it beautifully. With benches, gravel areas for standing and mingling, and well designed sections, the space was not

only attractive, but truly functional for gatherings and celebrations.

LOOKING AHEAD

For now, the garden feels whole and complete — a finished sanctuary designed to be enjoyed. The homeowners are thrilled with how the project turned out and especially appreciative of the design team's ability to see possibilities where they once saw limitations. Secret Garden Landscapes offers a maintenance package as well, to help guide against gophers, pests and any professional upkeep needed. Their seasonal guide is also helpful, to direct residents on how to follow along on their own.

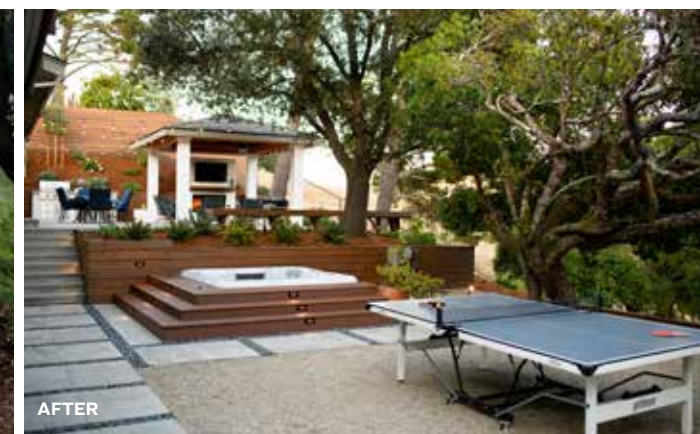

PEAR SOUP INGREDIENTS:

- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 1 tsp cumin
- 1-2 clove garlic, minced
- 3 cups veg. broth
- 1 Tbsn curry powder
- 2 cups **Delicata squash**, peeled and diced
- 1 Tbsn maple syrup
- 2 cups Bartlett pear, peeled and diced

COOKING STEPS

Heat 1T olive oil over medium heat, add onion and cook until soft. Add garlic, curry powder, syrup & cumin and cook 1-2 minutes, stirring. Add broth, squash and pears. Bring to a boil, reduce heat and simmer, covered, for 25 minutes until squash is soft. Puree with immersion blender until smooth.

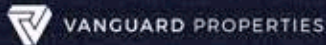
