Right in your own backyard, South Mountain is one of the best places in the Valley to watch a spectacular Arizona sunset or take in some panoramic city views. Within minutes of entering the park, you'll feel miles away from the city.

There are plenty of trailheads along the Ahwatukee border, but if you're looking to access a 2,000-foot vantage point when the sun is going down, especially if it's your first time on the mountain, we recommend a short road trip to the north side of the nature preserve. From Central Avenue, you can wind your way up to fabulous lookouts, like our cover shot from the Buena Vista Trail.

Established in 1924, South Mountain Park remains one of the largest municipal parks in the nation, so be sure to print out a map for your excursion of the twisting roads and many intersecting trails.

In addition to interesting rock formations, large boulders, and a variety of cacti, depending on your trail, you may also come across seasonal wildflowers, petroglyphs, abandoned mines, hang gliders, coyotes, chuckwalla, or even a Gila monster.


SAM MITCHELL





SOUTH MOUNTAIN IS THE BACKYARD FOR AHWATUKEE, AND IF YOU LIKE HIKING, BIKING, WALKING, OR RUNNING, YOU'RE IN THE RIGHT PLACE.

When it comes to choosing my favorite hiking trail in Ahwatukee, I have to go with what's known as the Elevator Ride. The Elevator Ride starts out at the Pyramid Trailhead. You take this trail out to the Lost Ranch Ruins Trail and hike right up into the actual ruins. You then drop through the back window. Believe it or not, this is still the Lost Ranch Ruins Trail, and it's steep from here. This will dump you out on the National Trail. I take this over to the Eliminator Trail, which is very steep going down. Once you come down off the mountain, you're back on the Lost Ranch Ruins Trail and then finally back to the Pyramid Trailhead. It is an amazing, difficult, and short hike, totaling about 5 miles.

When you go hiking, be prepared. Please remember to bring water. I recommend a backpack with a bladder. Wear a good pair of hiking shoes, a hat, hiking pants or shorts, and a synthetic shirt, not cotton. Bring snacks and a cellphone, and use sunscreen.

In addition to having hiked on every single trail that South Mountain has to offer, some of my other accomplishments include:

- ▶ **Hiking the 20 highest mountains in Arizona**
- ▶ **Hiking to the highest point in every county in Arizona.** *We have 15 counties.*
- ▶ **Reaching the highest point in every state, except for Alaska, better known as the 49er club.**

I love hiking, trail running, and mountaineering. I am happy to help and answer questions for those who share the same passions. It all starts with the first step.

SOUTH MOUNTAIN TRAILS



With a total of 16,000 acres and over 50 miles of trails for hiking, horseback riding, and mountain biking, South Mountain Park is one of the largest municipally managed parks in the U.S.

DESERT VISTA TRAILHEAD ▶ This is better known as Telegraph Pass, which is a very famous trail that's short but steep. This hike leads to incredible views once you make it to the top of the road. You can go a little further to the rock house and enjoy even better views. Amenities are abundant at this trailhead.



PIMA CANYON TRAILHEAD ▶ Probably the most popular of all trailhead systems in South Mountain, this trailhead gives you access to several trails and is heavily trafficked. The route will take you to Fat Man's Pass via the National Trail. The amenities are abundant at this trailhead.

PYRAMID TRAILHEAD ▶ Located in west Ahwatukee, this trail system gives you access to the less traveled trails, but they're still busy. The famous Pyramid Trail, Eliminator Trail, and the Lost Ruins are out here. The trailhead has a parking lot but no bathrooms.

WARPAINT TRAILHEAD ▶ This trailhead will give you access to a lot of flat hiking where you can easily access the Warpaint Trail Loop and Desert Classic Trail. You can gain access to Young Man Trail, which is very steep and rated as difficult. Located in a private, upscale neighborhood, there is not much parking here.

FUN FACT

Every Sunday from 5-10 am, the roads of South Mountain are closed to motor vehicles for Silent Sunday, reserving the roadways exclusively for walking, cycling, jogging, and hiking. On the fourth Sunday of each month, Silent Sunday hours are extended to 7 pm.

"As far as hidden gems, the **Sivlik Grill** at Whirlwind Golf Club at Wild Horse Pass has the very best view for dining. They serve breakfast and lunch daily and host private dinners for large groups. The menu selection is not huge, but offers just enough to keep it interesting. The food is good and reasonably priced, and the staff is friendly. It's never too crowded, and the peace and tranquility of the Estrella Mountains can't be beat." – **Jen H.**



OTHER TRAILS AROUND TOWN



CAMELBACK MOUNTAIN

This very famous hike is underestimated by many. It's steep, short, and difficult. It's in Scottsdale and is incredibly busy, so be prepared for crowds. All amenities available at this trailhead.

PIESTEWA PEAK

► This very well-known hike is always super busy and is located in downtown Phoenix. It's a steep but short hike that's rated as difficult. All amenities are available at this trailhead.

PINNACLE PEAK

► This famous hike, located in north Scottsdale, has amazing views and is not too difficult or long. It is certainly one to add to your bucket list. All amenities are located at the trailhead.



More than 200 hikers are rescued annually from City of Phoenix desert and mountain parks. Prepare for your hike by checking the weather before you head out, wearing proper attire, bringing water, using sunscreen, having a fully charged phone, and staying on the designated trails.






A QUICK GUIDE TO PLANTING YOUR VEGGIES AND HERBS IN AHWATUKEE:

JANUARY: potatoes, asparagus transplants

FEBRUARY: sunflower seeds, artichoke transplants

MARCH: dill, watermelon, cantaloupe, sweet potato transplants, summer squash, tomato transplants, basil, lima beans, cucumber seeds, eggplant transplants, parsley, thyme

APRIL: okra, peanuts, black-eyed peas, oregano

MAY & JUNE: There are some seeds and transplants that you can begin in June, however, these months are the end of Chandler's first growing season.

JULY: winter squash seeds, pumpkin seeds, pepper transplants, shallots (sets of cloves), pinto beans

AUGUST: green onions, snap beans, carrots, corn, collard greens

SEPTEMBER: leeks, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, bok choy, parsnips, radishes, rutabaga, spinach, turnips, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, chard, endive, cilantro

OCTOBER: garlic, onions, peas, beets

NOVEMBER & DECEMBER: Spring and fall are the two optimal growing seasons in the Valley, however, there are still some seeds and transplants that can be successfully planted in the winter months.


There are a few different school tax credits that an individual may be eligible to claim.

An individual may claim a credit for making contributions or paying fees to a public school for support of qualified activities or qualified programs.

An individual may also claim two separate credits for making donations to a qualified school tuition organization for scholarships to private schools.

Additionally, an individual who is a shareholder of an S corporation may claim two separate credits for contributions made to a qualified school tuition organization when the S corporation qualifies for a corporate credit and makes an election to pass that credit through to its individual shareholders.

The credits may only be used to the extent they reduce a tax liability to zero. Any unused amounts may be carried forward for not more than five consecutive taxable years.

Welcome to Ahwatukee! We are so happy to share our amazing community with new families and welcome the opportunity to help you navigate our friendly neighborhood. Ahwatukee is packed with amazing schools, great eats, and family-friendly activities. We're so glad you're here.

As a speech-language pathologist and owner of Desert Valley Pediatric Therapy, finding a family-focused community to live and work was a high priority for me. No matter where your child falls within the developmental domains, Ahwatukee has the resources you're looking for. At Desert Valley Pediatric Therapy, we help children in all the developmental domains.

Communication: This domain targets the words and language we use, the language we hear, and written language.

Gross Motor: This involves using all the "big" muscles in the body for crawling, walking, and jumping.

Fine Motor: This involves using the "small" muscles in our hands and wrists for coloring, cutting with scissors, and writing.

Cognition: This domain focuses on understanding cause and effect as well as reasoning skills.

Social-Emotional: Learning to play with others is an important skill to learn. This domain also involves making sure kids feel safe and nurtured.

Self Help/Adaptive/Feeding: This involves learning to do daily activities all by yourself, such as feeding, dressing, brushing teeth, and using the toilet.



If you're wondering if your child is progressing as expected in one or more of the developmental domains, ask yourself these questions. **Is your child:**

- ▶ babbling by 9 months?
- ▶ saying a first word by 15 months?
- ▶ using consistent words by 18 months?
- ▶ using word combinations by 24 months?
- ▶ seeming to understand and follow commands?
- ▶ rolling by 7 months?
- ▶ sitting independently by 10 months?
- ▶ crawling on hands and knees by 12 months?
- ▶ walking by 18 months?
- ▶ frequently walking on tip toes?
- ▶ frequently falling/tripping for no apparent reason?
- ▶ clapping by 12 months?
- ▶ able to hold a bottle by themselves by 12 months?
- ▶ using only one hand to complete tasks?
- ▶ drooling during tasks that require concentration?
- ▶ having trouble transitioning from one activity to another?
- ▶ moving ALL THE TIME?
- ▶ spinning or swinging excessively?
- ▶ coughing, choking, or gagging during or shortly after drinking or eating?
- ▶ having ongoing poor weight gain or loss of weight?
- ▶ having difficulty accepting baby purées by 10 months of age and solids by 12 months of age?
- ▶ eating less than 20 foods and/or omits an entire food group by age 2?
- ▶ needing distractions to eat (for example, TV or tablet)?





Phoenix Public Library's Ironwood location has been serving the Ahwatukee area for 30 years after opening its doors on October 26, 1991.

As one of Phoenix Public Library's busiest locations, community members can check out books, laptops and WiFi hot spots, seeds to plant a garden, Culture Passes, and more. Ironwood Library is more than a place to check out items; it's also a hub for area residents, providing a space for people to come together as a community.

One of the most popular community programs at the Ironwood branch is the seed library. A variety of fruit, vegetable and perennial seeds are available, such as sweet basil, California poppy and cherry tomato.

Patrons can check out up to three seed packets at one time per library card, every three weeks. Seeds are rotated depending on the season and only include those that will grow in a desert climate. The program also provides patrons the tools, information and programming to start a garden wherever they are able — whether it's in a backyard, a container or a community space.





Longtime Ahwatukee resident Gary Eyre was just 19 years old in 1953 when he walked away from a full athletic scholarship at the University of Wyoming to enlist in the Marines. "I'd lost a dear friend to the war and knew several others who were injured," says Eyre. He later completed college and earned a doctorate in education.

But in 1954 he found himself as gunnery sergeant for a machine gun platoon in the Korean Demilitarized Zone (DMZ). He describes the DMZ as the last line of defense in the war, and when night fell, he and his platoon walked patrols knowing there could be conflict at any time.

After being discharged in 1956, Eyre stayed connected to military service by getting involved. As a member of the East Valley Marine Detachment, he lends his support to military families through participation in and support of the group's Marine Corps Military Ball, Toys for Tots, an annual sponsored golf tournament, and other activities.

As it turns out, service runs in the family. Eyre's son, Trulan, was an Air Force fighter pilot and retired as a Major

General. His grandson, Travis, was in the Marine Corps serving in an aviation division. Reflecting on being a Marine, Eyre thinks of those who have served with pride, honesty, and integrity in their lives.



The Early Years OF AHWATUKEE

Frank Lloyd Wright

Recognized as America's preeminent architect, in 1928 Wright was hired by Dr. Alexander Chandler to design a grand resort in the South Mountain foothills on land holdings that eventually became western Mountain Park Ranch. It was never built, although it served as inspiration for Wright's Taliesin West in North Scottsdale.



Kyrene Farming Community

Reginald Elliott and Samuel Warner both homesteaded in the Kyrene area in the early years of the 20th century. Elliott was born in California and came to the Arizona Territory in 1914. He homesteaded 160 acres on the southeast corner of today's Priest Drive and Elliot Road. An error in the naming of Elliot Road accounts for the different spelling of the family and roadway names. Warner, a Kansas native, arrived in 1908 to homestead 160 acres, currently home to Warner Business Park.

The Ahwatukee Ranch

The September 29, 1921, issue of the *Chandler Arizona* reported that a house unmatched in scope and size was being built in the foothills of South Mountain by a couple named Ames. A dentist and his wife wished to winter in Arizona and called their 12,000-square-foot home their Casa de Sueños, Spanish for "house of dreams." In the 1930s, the home's second owner, Helen Brinton, began referring to the house as Ahwatukee, purportedly a rough translation of the Spanish name into the language of the Crow Nation. The exact meaning of Ahwatukee remains unclear, but in time the word came to refer not only to the house but to the land surrounding it.




Route to Ahwatukee

While Brinton enjoyed a quiet and conservative lifestyle, she entertained winter guests from the Midwest at the ranch on a regular basis. This printed card served as a directional map for her visitors. The seven miles of West Chandler Road marked the distance between the San Marcos hotel in Chandler and 56th Street. The ranch was two miles straight west on Warner Road, which ended at the ranch's garage.


The Master-Planned Development of Ahwatukee

This captures the gradual transformation of an area with a solitary, isolated ranch, several hundred acres of farmland, and water supplied by a few wells, to the beginning of the residential community and its modern infrastructure of today. In this 1973 photograph, the Ahwatukee ranch remains undisturbed, but Warner Road is not on the straight road that it had been. Less than 200 houses dot the landscape in the newly constructed development with pavement on Warner and Elliot Roads ending at 48th Street at the loop configuration, barely an outline in the dirt. The rectangular Fort Ahwatukee stands guard at the top of the photograph with streetlights, street signs, and fire hydrants still a year away.



Putting Ahwatukee on the Map

Randall Presley, Ahwatukee visionary and developer, needed to be creative to attract people to the first master-planned community on the south side of South Mountain. He decided to hire a 29-year-old staff architect at the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation to design the House of the Future. It had to have three core marketing concepts: It must be different, have a unique visual impact, and serve as a demonstration home that could accommodate large numbers of people. Between 1980 and 1984, some 250,000 people toured the house and, in the process, got a look at the fledgling community of Ahwatukee.

Lakewood

Today, Lakewood has its signature water, circular parkway, and central greenbelt. But in 1951, it was the the Collier-Evans Ranch, encompassing 1,600 acres of leased farmland on the Gila River Indian Reservation between 48th and 32nd streets' alignments. Here, Dick Evans keeps the birds at bay in a cornfield on the ranch.




Paving the Way

International Harvester Company's Phoenix Proving Grounds were established in 1946 on a six-and-a-half-square-mile tract of isolated desert west of the Kyrene farming community, the heart of what would later become The Foothills and Club West. The communities' main roads were constructed over the proving ground's seven and a quarter-mile and four-mile test tracks, both unpaved in this 1953 photograph.



Picture Rock

A number of petroglyph sites were located within the proving grounds' six and a half square miles. The giant Picture Rock was found just inside the northeast portion of the large paved test track. Standing six feet, four inches tall, Harvester surveyor Dale Milner admires the rock in its natural setting in 1953.



An Ahwatukee Mystery

At the foot of South Mountain, the Lost Ranch stands guard over all that it surveys, miles southeast to the Gila River Indian Community. Easily accessed via A City of Phoenix trailhead and natural wash not far from 17th Avenue, the ruins sit about one mile northwest of the nearest neighborhood. No records exist that might explain the circumstances, background, or intent of the structure and whoever built it.




Highway to the Future

The I-10 Maricopa Freeway rush hour traffic approaching the Elliot Road overpass was a bit lighter in 1969, as an unobstructed Camelback Mountain beckoned in the distance. The freeway served as a major catalyst for the development of Ahwatukee-Foothills.






KIWANIS EASTER PARADE & SPRING FLING


